Music?

Aural Communication?

Okay, But Why Does It Matter?

We can talk about the whos, the whats, the wheres, and the hows, but for it to be important we need the **WHY**.

WHY should we bother exploring the idea that music is *actually* psychological and *actually* representative of the human condition?

In other words, why do we care to learn *or* know more about music than the fact that it exists?

Intro To The Fundamentals

Music makes us FEEL.

Music makes us THINK.

Music helps SPREAD A MESSAGE.

Music ENGAGES us.

Music CHANGES us.

These are five fundamentals that make a world of difference.

Fundamental: **FEEL**

Music makes us feel something. Psychologically, we feel before we understand why, what, who, where, or how we are feeling.

If we didn't, there would be no need for psychologists and psychiatrists.

If music isn't something that physically touches us, how is it possible to feel it? What elements help us to feel music?

Fundamental : **THINK**

It is rare to find a piece of music that says literally what it means to say. Music is filled with references, metaphors, and similes.

Is this intentional to force us to think?

OR

Is it done to see who actually thinks?

(Those that choose not to think miss out on the actual message)

Fundamental: **SPREAD A MESSAGE**

Even instrumental music is created with this idea that it is supposed to spread a message. Otherwise we wouldn't have created it in the first place.

Children listen to music to learn about things like colors, languages, seasons, or important life lessons (tying shoes, brushing teeth, ect.)

Adults listen to music to spread messages that can be political, radical, emotional, or psychological.

What other kinds of messages can music spread?

Fundamental: **ENGAGEMENT**

These types of events primarily allow us to engage with each other. It creates a sense of unity, of understanding, and of support?

Fundamental: **CHANGE**

If music wasn't meant to change us, we would never hear anything new. All of the songs we'd ever heard would be songs our great, great, great grandparents listened to from their previous generations.

Music changes, because it's supposed to change us.
